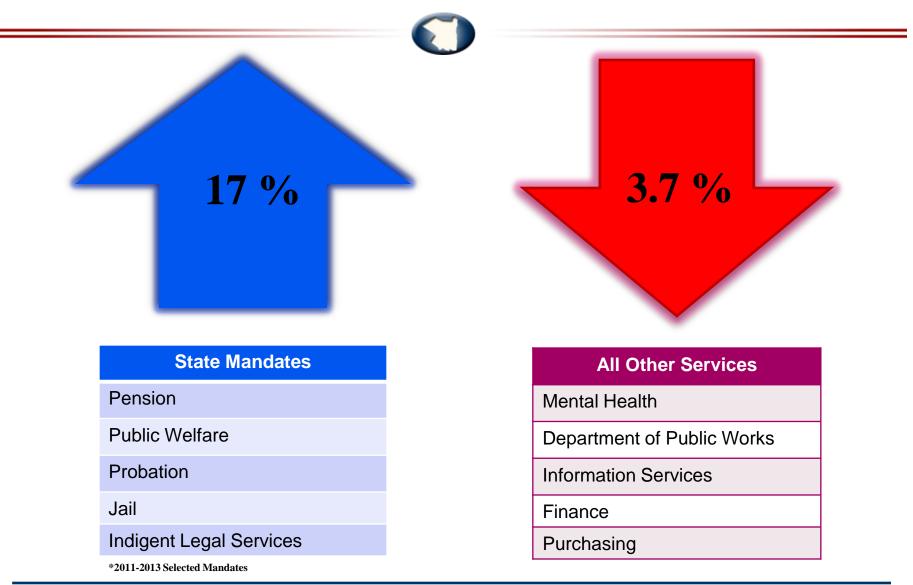

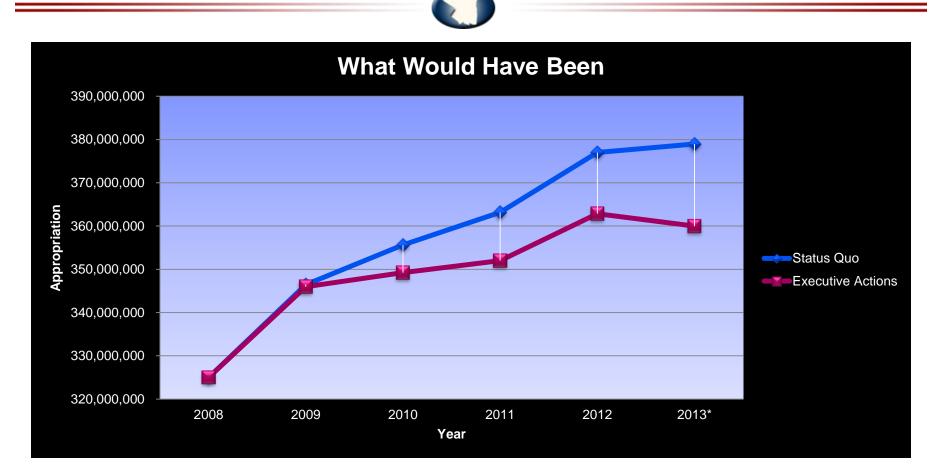
Two Facts Remain

- 1. The State Legislature has not shown a willingness to save New York counties from unfunded mandates.
- 2. To continue essential services and protect taxpayers, we have to be willing to implement fundamental change.

- > The 2013 Executive Budget proposes a three year County take over of Safety Net
- This action will deliver approximately \$11 Million dollars in budgetary relief to the City of Kingston and the Towns

Resource Recovery Agency (RRA)

Ulster County is responsible for \$23 Million in past debt incurred by the RRA

The County is responsible to pay the Net Service Fee, which was projected to be \$2.5 Million in 2013

Resource Recovery Agency (RRA)

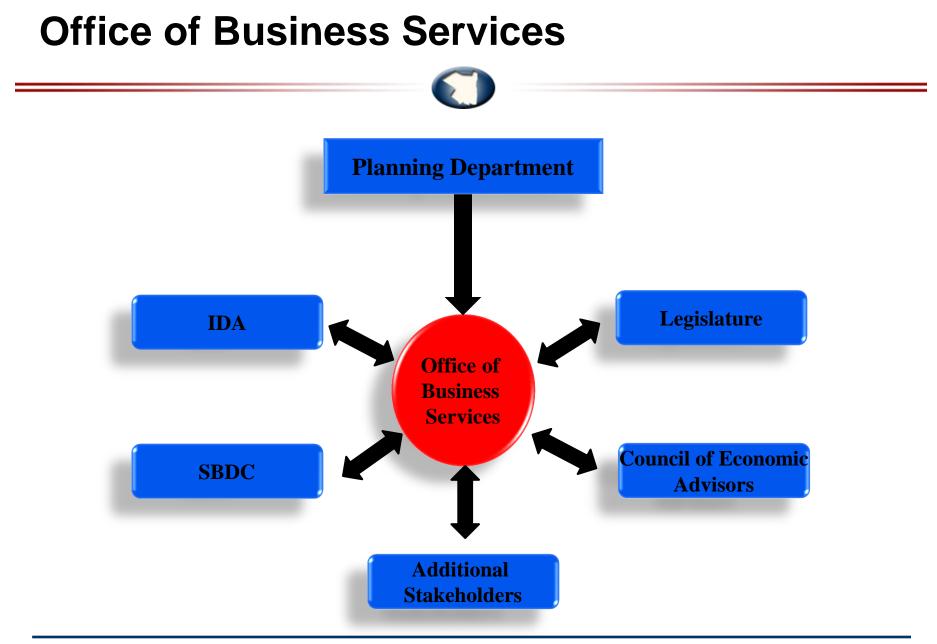
> To solve this systemic problem, this budget proposes a modified flow control law

- > Eliminates the Net Service Fee
- Increases business opportunities for small local haulers

Economic Development

The Ulster County Development Corporation/Industrial Development Agency model is broken

- New model will save over \$200,000 in taxpayer money
- Executive branch partners with Legislative Committee and the private sector to grow Ulster County's economy <u>together</u>



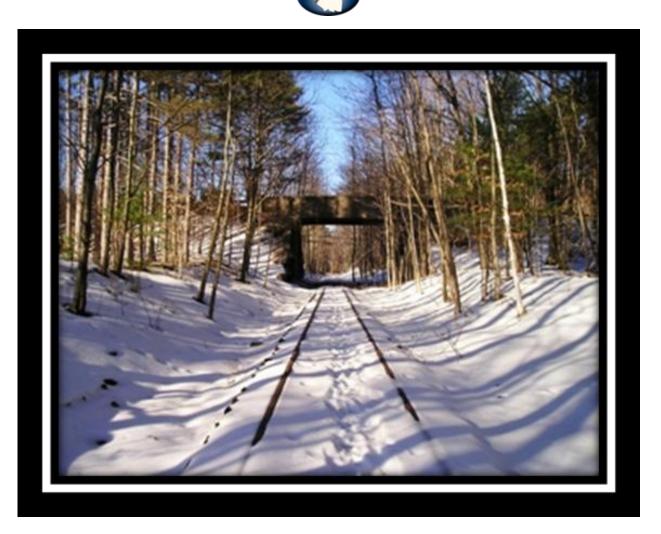

Consolidating & Restructuring

- > Real Property into Finance
- > Economic Development into Planning
- STOP DWI into Probation
- > A major reorganization of Mental Health



- The goal is to restructure County government into a more sustainable organization
- Since taking office Executive staffing levels are down over 20%
- Staffing levels are down 213 positions since 2009. The 2013 budget continues this difficult but necessary process with:
 - 18 Separation Incentives
 - 44 Vacancies
 - 28 Layoffs

A nominal surcharge of \$5 per year on passenger vehicles under 3,500lbs and \$10 for vehicles over 3,500lbs to support County infrastructure

The majority of counties (36) already have this surcharge in place

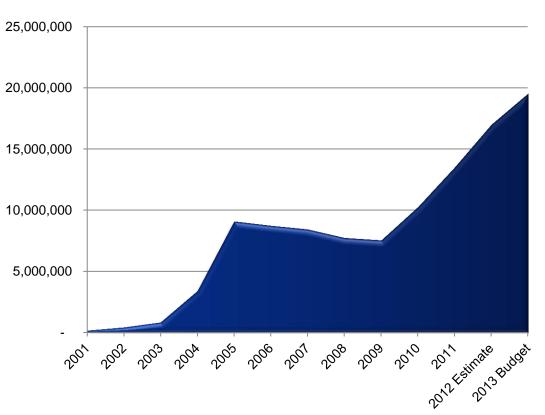
Sheriff's Road Patrol

Public Safety

- The Sheriff's Road Patrol plays a critical role in Ulster County and the 2013 Executive Budget continues to support this program
- The 2013 Executive Budget affirms the commitment to public safety through an additional Corrections Officer and Assistant District Attorney
- In an effort to further protect law enforcement funding, we will be consolidating our "STOP DWI" efforts into the Probation Department

County Pension Costs

- The County pension contribution rose to \$19.5 Million in 2013
- Pension costs are up 4,323% since 2002





Pension costs continue to skyrocket

- The percentage of aid the State provides continues to be reduced
- Mandates continue to make up more than 70% of the Ulster County budget
- The PBA settlement may cost Ulster County taxpayers Millions

Tax Cap

The Ulster County property tax cap for 2013 is \$80,735,216 a potential increase of: \$1,082,322 or 1.37%

NO PROPERTY TAX INCREASE IS BUDGETED FOR 2013!

Sales tax trends are indicating slight continued growth

 > 2013 sales tax is projected to be \$90.1 Million, an increase of 2.5% from the 2012 estimate

Fund Balance

To protect property taxpayers, \$10 Million has been appropriated from the \$24.8 Million 2012 General Fund balance leaving 5% or \$14.8 Million

This is \$850,000 less than last year's General Fund appropriation
