 - a) <u>UCTC Resolution 2021-06: Allocation of Previously Unallocated Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5307 Formula Funds for Regional Transit Projects.</u>

In February of 2021, UCTC in conjunction with Dutchess County Transportation Council and Orange County Transportation Council, in their cooperative functions representing the Mid-Hudson Valley Transportation Management Area, issued a call for projects for unallocated Federal Transit Administration Section 5307 funds. Five applications were received and reviewed by the MPOs with input and oversight from NYSDOT Region 8 Transit staff. The TMA selected two projects for full funding and one project for partial funding. Funding for two projects was declined based on incomplete application materials. Award details and project descriptions are provided in Attachment 1 of Draft Resolution 2018-06, which authorizes distribution of the awards to the respective applicants.

Recommended Action: Discuss Resolution 2021-06 and consider adoption (30 minutes).

b) Resolution 2021-07: Support New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) Targets for Safety Performance Measures.

Resolution 2021-7 updates Safety Performance Measures based on new targets adopted by NYSDOT for 2022; original 2018 targets were approved by UCTC under Resolution 2017-12 and updated for each subsequent Federal fiscal year under the following UCTC Resolutions: 2019-09, 2019-19 and 2020-17. Safety Performance Management (Safety PM) is part of the overall Transportation Performance Management (TPM) program, which FHWA defines as a strategic approach that uses system information to make investment and policy decision to achieve national performance goals. The Safety PM Final Rule supports the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP), as it establishes safety performance measure requirements for the purpose of carrying out the HSIP and to assess fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads.

The Safety PM Final Rule establishes five performance measures as the five-year rolling averages to include:

- 1. Number of Fatalities
- 2. Rate of Fatalities per 100 million Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT)
- 3. Number of Serious Injuries
- 4. Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT
- 5. Number of Non-motorized Fatalities and Non-motorized Serious Injuries

The Safety PM Final Rule also establishes the process for State Departments of Transportation (DOTs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) to establish and report their safety targets, and the process that FHWA will use to assess whether State DOTs have met or made significant progress toward meeting their safety targets. NYSDOT has closely coordinated the establishment of safety targets with the 14 MPOs in NYS through the NYS Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations. Through that process, NYSDOT has requested all MPOs to adopt the NYSDOT targets to establish uniformity during the initial reporting period.

Recommended Action: Discuss Resolution 2021-07 and consider adoption (30 minutes).

c) Resolution 2021-08: Amendment to the Ulster County Transportation Council State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2021/22 Unified Planning Work to Add New Project as Shown in Attachment 1.

In an effort to provide a more organized, dynamic and interactive online experience, the UCTC will update its website using professional assistance. Goals of the website update include but are not necessarily limited to: improved organization of and access to existing UCTC plans, reports and documents; addition of online mapping compatibility; improved mobile format; improved compatibility and functionality with complimentary webtools (incl. social media, email, notifications, calendars and surveys); ability to adapt web content and themes to fit with UCTC's newly-adopted style guide; and improved ADA access and functionality.

A total of \$35,000 in federal FHWA PL funds will be drawn from UCTC savings, including an estimated \$30,000 for consultant procurement and \$5,000 for staff support. If approved, the amendment will decrease UCTC PL savings from \$313,608 to \$278,608.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: Discuss Resolution 2021-08, review any public comments received, and consider adoption (30 minutes).
