 - a) UCTC Resolution 2022-09: Apportionment of Federal Fiscal Year 2021 Federal Transit Administration Section 5307/5340 Formula Funds in the Mid-Hudson Transportation Management Area.

Draft UCTC Resolution 2022-09 seeks approval for the allocation of <u>FFY 2021</u> Federal Transit Administration (FTA) <u>Section 5307 formula funds</u> in the three-county Mid-Hudson Valley Transportation Management Area (TMA). This action is a routine occurrence that takes place after the FTA apportions 5307 funds to the TMA (UZA 89) and NY and NJ come to an agreement on a fair and rational sub-regional allocation. FTA Section 5307 funds flow to the TMA, responsibility for which is shared by three Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs): the UCTC, Orange County Transportation Council (OCTC), and Dutchess Transportation Council (DCTC). The three Councils must first agree to the TMA allocation prior to distributing the transit funds to their respective designated recipients; the OCTC and DCTC will approve similar resolutions.

For FFY 2021, Ulster County (Ulster County Area Transit) will receive an allocation of \$572,002; \$2,576,161 is made available to Inter-County Commuter Bus Service Providers in Ulster County; and \$4,593,343 will be made available for future TMA programming (savings).

Recommended Action: Discuss the proposed resolution and consider approval (15 minutes).

b) <u>Draft UCTC Resolution 2022-10: Apportionment of Federal Fiscal Year 2022 Federal Transit Administration Section 5307/5340 Formula Funds in the Mid-Hudson Transportation Management Area.</u>

Draft UCTC Resolution 2022-10 seeks approval for the allocation of <u>FFY 2022</u> Federal Transit Administration (FTA) <u>Section 5307 formula funds</u> in the three-county Mid-Hudson Valley Transportation Management Area (TMA). This action is a routine occurrence that takes place after the FTA apportions 5307 funds to the TMA (UZA 89) and NY and NJ come to an agreement on a fair and rational sub-regional allocation. FTA Section 5307 funds flow to the TMA, responsibility for which is shared by three Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs): the UCTC, Orange County Transportation Council (OCTC), and Dutchess Transportation Council (DCTC). The three Councils must first agree to the TMA allocation prior to distributing the transit funds to their respective designated recipients; the OCTC and DCTC will approve similar resolutions.

For FFY 2022, Ulster County (Ulster County Area Transit) will receive an allocation of \$895,654; \$2,314,513 is made available to Inter-County Commuter Bus Service Providers in Ulster County; and \$5,152,731 will be made available for future TMA programming (savings).

c) <u>Draft UCTC Resolution 2022-11: Apportionment of Federal Fiscal Year 2021 Federal Transit Administration Section 5339 Formula Funds in the Mid-Hudson Transportation Management Area</u>

The Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities program (49 U.S.C. 5339) makes Federal resources available to States and designated recipients to replace, rehabilitate and purchase buses and related equipment and to construct bus-related facilities including technological changes or innovations to modify low or no emission vehicles or facilities. Funding is provided through formula allocations and competitive grants. A sub-program provides competitive grants for bus and bus facility projects that support low and zero-emission vehicles.

Draft UCTC Resolution 2022-11 seeks approval for the allocation of <u>FFY 2021</u> Federal Transit Administration (FTA) <u>Section 5339 formula funds</u> in the three-county Mid-Hudson Valley Transportation Management Area (TMA). These funds stem from federal authorizations to the TMA (UZA 89) under the Bus and Bus Facilities Program. FTA Section 5339 funds flow to the TMA, responsibility for which is shared by three Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs): the UCTC, Orange County Transportation Council (OCTC), and Dutchess Transportation Council (DCTC). The three Councils must first agree to the TMA allocation, prior to distributing the

transit funds to their respective designated recipients. The OCTC and DCTC must approve similar resolutions.

For <u>FFY 2021</u>, Ulster County (Ulster County Area Transit) will receive a total of <u>\$440,693</u> in FTA 5339 funds; a 20% local match is required.

d) <u>Draft UCTC Resolution 2022-12: Apportionment of Federal Fiscal Year 2022 Federal Transit Administration Section 5339 Formula Funds in the Mid-Hudson Transportation Management Area</u>

Draft UCTC Resolution 2022-12 seeks approval for the allocation of <u>FFY 2022</u> Federal Transit Administration (FTA) <u>Section 5339 formula funds</u> in the three-county Mid-Hudson Valley Transportation Management Area (TMA). These funds stem from federal authorizations to the TMA (UZA 89) under the Bus and Bus Facilities Program. FTA Section 5339 funds flow to the TMA, responsibility for which is shared by three Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs): the UCTC, Orange County Transportation Council (OCTC), and Dutchess Transportation Council (DCTC). The three Councils must first agree to the TMA allocation, prior to distributing the transit funds to their respective designated recipients. The OCTC and DCTC must approve similar resolutions.

For <u>FFY 2022</u>, Ulster County (Ulster County Area Transit) will receive a total of <u>\$423,510</u> in FTA 5339 funds; a 20% local match is required.

e) <u>Draft UCTC Resolution 2022-13: Distribution of the FFY 2020 Federal Transit</u> <u>Administration Section 5339 Small Urbanized Area Apportionments Attributable to the Kingston Urbanized Area as Shown in Attachment 1.</u>

Draft Resolution 2022-13 seeks to distribute FTA Sec 5339 program apportionments made to Small Urbanized Areas (SUZAs) in New York State, including the Kingston SUZA.

The Resolution seeks approval of the apportionment of Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2020 Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5339 formula funds to the designated recipient in Ulster County -- Ulster County Area Transit. For **FFY 2020, \$344,295** is available.

Recommended Action: Discuss the proposed resolution and consider approval (15 minutes).

f) <u>Draft UCTC Resolution 2022-14: Distribution of the FFY 2021 Federal Transit</u> <u>Administration Section 5339 Small Urbanized Area Apportionments Attributable to the Kingston Urbanized Area as Shown in Attachment 1.</u>

Draft Resolution 2022-14 seeks to distribute FTA Sec 5339 program apportionments made to Small Urbanized Areas (SUZAs) in New York State, including the Kingston SUZA.

The Resolution seeks approval of the apportionment of Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2021 Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5339 formula funds to the designated recipient in Ulster County -- Ulster County Area Transit. For **FFY 2021, \$337,010** is available.

g) <u>Draft UCTC Resolution 2022-15: Distribution of the FFY 2022 Federal Transit</u> <u>Administration Section 5339 Small Urbanized Area Apportionments Attributable to the Kingston Urbanized Area as Shown in Attachment 1.</u>

Draft Resolution 2022-15 seeks to distribute FTA Sec 5339 program apportionments made to Small Urbanized Areas in New York State.

The Resolution seeks approval of the apportionment of Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2022 Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5339 formula funds to the designated recipient in Ulster County -- Ulster County Area Transit. For **FFY 2022, \$369,677** is available.

Recommended Action: Discuss the proposed resolution and consider approval (15 minutes).

h) <u>Draft UCTC Resolution 2022-16: Amendment to the UCTC Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2020-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to Add New Ulster County PIN 876289 as Shown in Attachment 1.</u>

Draft Resolution 2022-16 seeks to add a new project to the UCTC 2020-2024 Transportation Improvement Program. In June 2022 Ulster County was awarded \$3.961 in federal Transportation Alternative Program funds by the NYS Department of Transportation for the construction of the proposed U&D Phase 1 Project – Highmount to Giggle Hollow.

The project will provide a 2.5 mi. multi-use nonmotorized transportation connection between the hamlet of Highmount and Belleayre Beach Day Use Area (DUA) in the Town of Shandaken. The project will implement the results of the U&D Corridor Revitalization Study by establishing the first phase of a multi-phase project to connect to the hamlet of Big Indian to Highmount, ultimately a 5 mi. corridor in total.

Transportation Alternative Program funds require a 20% local match; the total project cost is \$4.950 million.

UCTC Operating Procedures stipulate that any new project to be added to the TIP requires UCTC Technical Committee approval, 15 day public notice and comment period and final Policy Committee approval.

Note that the original resolution presented to the Technical Committee in August suggested amending the 2023 TIP; because the 2023 STIP has not yet been approved, NYSDOT staff have instructed the UCTC to perform the amendment to the current 2020 TIP, which will then roll automatically into the new 2023 STIP once it is approved.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: Discuss the proposed resolution, review any public comment received, and consider approval (15 minutes).
